Why Retirees Consider It

- Milder highland climate than many coastal or desert destinations
- Access to Guadalajara for broader medical and airport options
- Established social and service networks for international residents
- Walkable pockets with restaurants, markets, and community activities

Important Tradeoffs

- Elevation and uneven streets may affect some retirees
- Healthcare depth varies; some care may require travel to Guadalajara
- Housing demand, noise, and walkability differ sharply by neighborhood
- Dry and rainy seasons should both be experienced

May Be a Strong Fit For

- Retirees seeking community and a milder climate
- People comfortable with a smaller-town rhythm near a major city
- Those willing to test elevation, sidewalks, and healthcare travel

Retirement Fit Questions

- Would the climate work for me during the most difficult season?
- Can I reach the healthcare and specialists I may need?
- Could I manage daily life if I stopped driving?
- How easily can family reach me and how often will I return to the United States?
- Does the community fit my preferred pace, language comfort, and social needs?

Scouting-Trip Checklist

- Stay in an ordinary neighborhood, not only a resort area
- Travel to a hospital, pharmacy, grocery store, and airport connection
- Test internet, cell service, water, cooling, and transportation
- Visit during daytime and evening; note noise, lighting, sidewalks, and traffic

- Record facts, concerns, and follow-up questions before discussing property

Verify Before Acting

- Hospital and specialist travel time
- Airport transportation and traffic
- Water, internet, noise, and accessibility by neighborhood
- Current rental terms and local conditions

Important: Conditions, prices, services, safety information, regulations, insurance terms, and immigration procedures can change. Verify current information directly with official agencies, providers, insurers, and qualified professionals.
