Why Retirees Consider It

- More extensive city services than many small coastal towns
- Regional healthcare, dining, and cultural options
- Working-city economy beyond tourism
- Varied neighborhoods and nearby recreation

Important Tradeoffs

- Hills and traffic can affect mobility
- Water and utility questions vary by neighborhood
- Border access takes longer than from Rosarito
- Port, tourism, and local activity can create noise or congestion

May Be a Strong Fit For

- Retirees wanting a real city with coastal access
- Food and culture-oriented residents
- People comfortable with urban variety and driving

Retirement Fit Questions

- Would the climate work for me during the most difficult season?
- Can I reach the healthcare and specialists I may need?
- Could I manage daily life if I stopped driving?
- How easily can family reach me and how often will I return to the United States?
- Does the community fit my preferred pace, language comfort, and social needs?

Scouting-Trip Checklist

- Stay in an ordinary neighborhood, not only a resort area
- Travel to a hospital, pharmacy, grocery store, and airport connection
- Test internet, cell service, water, cooling, and transportation
- Visit during daytime and evening; note noise, lighting, sidewalks, and traffic

- Record facts, concerns, and follow-up questions before discussing property

Verify Before Acting

- Hospital and specialist capability
- Water, internet, drainage, and road access
- Travel time to border and airports
- Neighborhood fit at different times of day

Important: Conditions, prices, services, safety information, regulations, insurance terms, and immigration procedures can change. Verify current information directly with official agencies, providers, insurers, and qualified professionals.
